- 18 programs have been running until 2014.

As a follow-up, 2 workshops of a few weeks have been organized at the end of 2014, on closely related topics:

- 1 workshop on discovery of scientific information
- 1 workshop on information literacy didactics.

The participants to those workshops were

- experts from relatively developed countries,
- & selected, enthusiastic, successful former participants to the training programs, who have evolved to become local experts.

- 1 result of that workshop on information literacy is a series of identified challenges
   & corresponding recommendations.
- To reach a wider audience, these have been presented at conferences & workshops in
  - The Philippines,
  - »India,
  - »Lithuania,
  - »Cuba,
  - & have been published in open access.

### Conclusions 1 of 2

- Clearly we deal not with simply 1 project and its outcomes,
   but with a series of organically growing activities.
- This is a successful consequence of the approach known as "teaching the teachers".
- Also the phrase "snowball effect" is applicable here in a positive way.
